Community Living British Columbia [CLBC] delivers support and services to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. CLBC staff strives to adhere to the corporate vision of **'Good lives in welcoming communities'**.

PAC is the designated tertiary care mental health service for individuals aged 14 years and older who have a developmental disability and a concurrent mental illness or behavioural concern. PAC is the only center in BC that provides specialized inpatient assessment and treatment for dually diagnosed individuals. The nurses at PAC are part of the multi disciplinary team that provides a comprehensive 90 day assessment or a 30 day stabilization and reintegration into community.

### **The Role:**

Under the direction of the Shift Supervisor/Nurse in Charge, as a member of the behavioural support team follows the positive behavioural support plan to provide psychiatric and physical care for individuals admitted to PAC. Provides input into plans, develops and implements group and individual goals for individuals and incorporates assessment, observation, interventions and plans and participates in both group or individual day to day care activities.

### **Qualifications:**

Completion of Grade 12. Post Secondary training and satisfactory completion of related competencies of a Community Mental Health Program i.e. Health Care Support Worker. Minimum 3 years of experience working with clients in a related field. Suitability is assessed on the basis of an applicant's physical and emotional health, education background, life experiences, and ability to work with others.

Class 5 driver's license, current Occupational First Aid Level 1 Certificate required. Successful applicants are required to work shifts and are subject to a criminal record review.
