Mary H. seconded the motion and it was carried.</li> </ul>

Tracey Michell	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Services for Aboriginal Individuals and Families were introduced in August 2014.</li> <li>• They were first announced to First Nation representatives before anything was posted on the website. Attached Question and Answer Sheet was posted on the website. The first public announcement was in September.</li> <li>• There is an Aboriginal Advisory Committee.</li> <li>• Liaison with CLBC Managers about how the information has been rolled out.</li> <li>• The Advisory Council has:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ reached out to all stakeholders, especially those from the First Nations.</li> <li>○ worked in collaboration with CLBC staff, to develop a staff question and answer system regarding the internal process. This process is repetition of what already exists within CLBC.</li> <li>○ begun a tracking system to find out how many people we serve On Reserve – mostly First Nation people (originally defined by Indian Act). Inuit and Metis may also be included.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• CLBC collects data on clients who self-identify as aboriginal.</li> <li>• Tracey will keep in touch with CLBC managers and be on top of issues that are raised.</li> <li>• Creating partnerships with Aboriginal service providers is a goal.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Services provided on-reserve pre-2009 have been grandfathered in to the new policy.</li> <li>• Each band will decide if they will be interested in hiring non-aboriginal service providers.</li> <li>• CLBC has not done a review of all Aboriginal individuals served to ask them if they want to change their services and receive them on-reserve. Service providers have the information about this new way delivering service and can approach their clients with it.</li> <li>• Final Annual Report will be done around July 2015, and will include how the new service is working.</li> <li>• Information on the new service is on the CLBC website under 'Aboriginal Advisory Committee'.</li> <li>• Creating an Aboriginal Competency framework for all CLBC staff, and community service providers has begun.</li> <li>• Kam and Kristen thought that Service Providers would like to be a part of a training program to educate their staff about Aboriginal people with diverse Abilities. There are presently programs about Aboriginal culture in general, but not as it relates specifically to diverse Ability.</li> </ul>

He will have to be re-nominated.</li> <li>• Todd and Ethel will receive letters, thanking them for being willing to be on the Council, but recognizing that this is not feasible at present.</li> <li>• Any flexibility for SICC Council meetings to be during day time was discussed. A meeting during the day would be difficult for people who work. Possibly we could have the meeting earlier, without a meal. A 4-5:30 meeting was discussed.</li> <li>• SICC is required to work on a recruitment strategy.</li> <li>• SICC has a process for nominating new council members. When Bev, Nigel and Mary have each completed a year off the Council, they will need to be nominated again.</li> </ul>
