

FAQ Home Share Training For Managers / Coordinators

Why is training
needed?

In 2020, through the work of the Social Service Sector Roundtable the BC CEO Network received funding from the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction to support the learning and development of Home Share providers and coordinators in the province. The BC CEO Network will disburse grants from the Training Fund to organizations across the province to access training specific to Home Share services.

Are home share
providers
required to take
training?

Home share providers are independent contractors, training cannot be mandated. CLBC has implemented home share standards that providers must adhere to. Training developed supports these core competencies.

How is training
accessed?

Most of the training will be offered through the Open Futures Learning (OFL) platform. OFL is a digital learning space dedicated to the disability workforce. Users will be able to access training through their organization.

How do home
share providers
know what
modules to take
and when?

A suggested learning plan has been developed to guide users through the recommended modules. In addition, an Administrator's Guide has been developed to assist organizations with their users' access and monitoring.

Organizations will access the platform through grant funding provided by the BC CEO Network. Organizations apply for funding via the BC CEO Network website. Grant funding will be provided for up to two years. Visit: www.bcceonetwork.ca for more information.
