| Meet and Greet Joanne Mills, Executive Director of Indigenous Relations            | <p>Joanne Mills, director for indigenous relations, discussed her commitments to improving services to Indigenous communities throughout the province. The creation of a strengthened Indigenous Community Living BC team will also support priorities established in the Re-Imagining Community Inclusion consultation process. We have 11 elders forming the Elder Advisory. Our elder advisory members will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Help to guide our provincial and regional work as we develop Indigenous strategies</li> <li>➤ Support our Indigenous Advisory Committee</li> <li>➤ Support the service delivery and design work happening across CLBC regions for Indigenous people living with a diverse ability</li> <li>➤ Support individuals accessing services through the Provincial Assessment Centre.</li> </ul> <p>To create awareness on community inclusion, establish trust and respect, we are doing a video to be able to share the voice of our self advocates on what community inclusion means. The plan is to build trusting relationships with Indigenous communities by improving awareness of CLBC and available supports and services among Indigenous People and communities and by increasing CLBC staff understanding about Indigenous Peoples’ history and culture.</p> <p>Joanne asked the council to invite her for any future events the council may have so as to create awareness.</p> <p>A logo contest will be developed as well in coming up with the Indigenous Advisory Committee logo.</p> |
