## **CLBC** Report

- Staffing Karen is back and is married, name change. Shannon is on maternity leave.
- Budget In the process now, trying to figure out what will be needed for 2017/2018. Part of this process is to look at all requests from last year that haven't been met to determine next year's needs. Trying to move from crisis spending only to more planned spending. There has been a 6 ½ % per year growth in people needing CLBC services, approximately 70-80 new people each year, bringing it close to 20,000 people served by CLBC each year. There are others eligible but have not sought out CLBC services. Jenny Cane is the person to connect with for new services.

Williams Lake Community Living is looking to get grants to offer more programs for transitioning youth ages 16 – 24.

Working with BC Housing – CLBC has recognized the need to start developing more group homes especially as individuals age and don't fit in to other options in the community/limited availability in the community, housing needs to fit with age related needs. The current housing is not fitting the needs physically. Other projects over the next 5 years, Clearwater – 26 unit multi-use housing with Work BC underneath – hopefully breaking ground by fall of 2017, using local contractors as much as possible. Some of the people served by Yellowhead Community Services are putting their names
