

2025 CLBC Provincial Advisory Committee Goals

The Community Living Authority Act, Part 2 Section 5.(6), requires CLBC's Board of Directors to establish a Provincial Advisory Committee.

The Role of the Provincial Advisory Council, or PAC:

- The PAC helps the CLBC Board **understand** the experience and priorities of the people they serve.
- The PAC is a **link** between Community Councils and the CLBC Board.
- The PAC **shares** successes and concerns raised by Community Councils.
- The PAC makes **suggestions** to the CLBC board and staff about how to improve the quality of life of people supported by CLBC.

The PAC Goals:

The following goals are established by the PAC to measure its performance. The annual PAC survey will be used to measure performance in each goal area.

- 1) To undertake meaningful **discussions** in PAC meetings where all members have a voice to talk about issues, identify issues of priority and new concerns.
- 2) To effectively **communicate significant concerns** of the community councils to the CLBC Board.
- 3) To describe, and quantify when possible, **improvements achieved** in each of the PAC's areas of priority described below.
- 4) To effectively **communicate back** to the respective community councils any actions taken by the CLBC Board and the CLBC management to address their concerns.

In September 2024, the PAC identified the following **areas of priority** at the provincial level:

- A. **Inclusive housing** that meets the needs of individuals and families served by CLBC.
- B. Prioritize support for **aging caregivers and individuals**.
- C. **Increased transparency** in how support is provided to the individuals and families served by CLBC.
- D. **Increased transparency and improved communication** from CLBC to community councils about how it makes decisions.
- E. **Increased support for the overall sustainability of Councils**
