3. Member Roundtable

Each PAC rep shared an update about Council membership, recruiting needs and what their Councils are working on.

4. <u>CLBC Strategic Plan – Process and Engagement with Councils</u>

Zainum Bahadshah and Jack Styan did a presentation on Strategic planning.

- Councils and the PAC play an important role in helping CLBC figure out what is most important to work on.
- From now until December, CLBC will be creating the next Strategic Plan (the big goals for CLBC to work on).
- CLBC will be using a process called Theory of Change.
- This process only works when there are lots and different kinds of ideas and experiences shared.
- Here are ways Councils can get involved in the CLBC Strategic Planning process:
 - PAC reps and Council Chairs can participate and give input at the May 29th joint meeting with the Board.
 - o Individuals Councils can schedule input sessions for May and/or Fall (Sept/Oct/Nov)

5. Guide to Support Allocation Research Project

- CLBC is working on a project to help improve the way CLBC supports individuals and families with the Guide to Support Allocation (GSA) Tool.
- The Guide to Support Allocation Tool is used by CLBC to help us understand an individual's challenges and difficulties, and to understand how much support the individual will need in 10 different areas of his or her life.
- PAC members shared their ideas and experiences about how the GSA tool can be used in a respectful way with individuals and families.

6. Board Report and Discussion

• The Board is in the final steps of hiring a new member who is a self advocate and brings the lived experience of having a diverse ability.

• The Self Advocate Leadership Network presented the Thinking about Language Project to the Board. This was a very helpful experience for the Board to hear directly from self advocates about the importance of the words we use when talking about people.

Members were asked to share these opportunities with their councils and provide feedback on any topics of interest.

7. Review draft Community Council One Hub

- Jessica shared the idea of having an online Community Council Hub.
- This would be an online place to store and share Council projects, work plans, recruitment strategies, as well as CLBC provincial project resources and materials.
- The Hub would also have a section for Council members to communicate with each other and share ideas.
- All Council members would have access to the Hub.
