- Planting trees to recognize the leadership of people with diverse abilities *Kootenay Council*
- Learning about inclusive housing developments in the *Surrey/Delta/White Rock Council* area
- Planning self advocate dance/outreach to local Rotary Club and Chamber of Commerce -North Shuswap Okanagan Council
- Re-imagining the North Council with Indigenous leaders in a culturally sensitive way -North Council
- Community BBQ and Strategic planning with Shelley Nessman Simon Fraser Council
- Outreach/Presenting to local Parks and Rec and Accessibility Committee Central Island Council

4. Greetings and updates from CLBC Indigenous Relations

Joanne Mills, Executive Director of Indigenous Relations, presented a PowerPoint presentation. She explained the different ways her team is working to strengthen CLBC's relationship with Indigenous people and their families and communities. Some of their work so far includes:

- Cultural sensitivity training for CLBC staff
- Creating a new CLBC Elder's Council
- Hiring new CLBC Indigenous Facilitator

5. Board Report and Discussion

- Simon Philp reminded PAC members about the Board report he provided before the meeting
- The next open board meeting is scheduled for May 11th. Council members are encouraged to attend, members were asked to share the opportunity with their councils.

6. New L.I.F.E.-based service presentation and feedback

Jack Styan presented information on the new L.I.F.E.-based service expanding to phase 1. L.I.F.E. stands for learning, inclusion, friendship, employment. The expansion plan of L.I.F.E. based service includes 15-20 new service providers in 2022-23 and then to 25-35 service providers in 2023-2024.

7. Planning for June 4th Annual Joint Meeting

Jessica reminded the group of the June 4th annual joint meeting.

8. <u>Update & discussion on use of Community Council One Hub</u>

- Members gave feedback on the new CLBC Community Council One Hub platform.
- One of the challenges for some Council members is navigating the One hub technology
- It was suggested to continue using One Hub for a bit longer to see if it helps Councils to store and share their work with each other.
