Submitting your application: where to find fax services

- Rental Benefit applications and documents must be submitted to CLBC by fax, to maintain individual privacy.
- You, someone in your support network, or your service provider can fax your application package to the CLBC Housing Team at: 236-468-1007
- Or you can e-mail the application package to 2364681007@fax.gov.bc.ca
- If you have questions or need support, contact CLBC's Housing Team: clbc.housingbenefit@gov.bc.ca.

Where can I find fax services?

★ Your local CLBC office

• You can also ask your local **CLBC office** to help you fax your documents or use another fax service in your community.

Note: if you take your application package to a CLBC office, you will not be able to drop it off. The CLBC staff member who helps you will need to return the package to you before you leave.

★ Staples Canada (Bureau en Gros in Quebec)

- **Service:** Faxing services (send/receive, international/domestic).
- **How to find:** Visit a local Staples store and ask at the **Print & Marketing Services** counter.
- Website: www.staples.ca
- **Cost:** Typically, \$1–2 per page for local faxes; more for long-distance or international.

★ Public Libraries

- Availability: Some public libraries offer fax services or have self-serve fax kiosks.
- How to check: Visit the library's website or call the branch directly.
- **Tip:** Larger urban libraries are more likely to offer this service.

★ Canada Post / Purolator Agent Locations

- **Service:** Some outlets may offer fax services (varies by location).
- How to find: Use the Canada Post or Purolator location finder and call ahead to ask.

★ UPS Stores

- **Service:** Faxing to local, national, and international numbers.
- **How to find:** Visit <u>www.theupsstore.ca</u> and use the location finder.
- Cost: Similar to Staples; varies by store.

★ Internet Cafes or Print Shops

- Availability: Independent print/copy shops or business centers often have fax machines.
- Where to check: Google Maps search for "fax services near me" or "copy and print shop."

★ Hotels and Business Centres

- Access: If you're staying at a hotel, the front desk or business center may have a fax machine.
- Note: Some hotels allow non-guests to use business services for a fee.

★ Pharmacy Chains (rare)

 Chains like Shoppers Drug Mart or Rexall may offer fax services at select locations, especially those with post office counters — but this is not common. Call to confirm.

★ Alternative: Online Fax Services

• If public machines are hard to find, consider using online faxing from your computer or phone: eFax, MyFax, Fax.Plus, or GotFreeFax (some offer free limited faxes).
